


## Classes and Instructors for the 24th Annual Musky Area Wood Carvers Workshop August 11 - 14, 2020

The following is the list of 10 different classes that our talented instructors have agreed to teach. Make your choice and submit your registration form.




**1. Jan Jenson** will teach Old World Chip Carving for the beginner and the more experienced carver. Learn to do it with 3 easy cuts! The pattern is rubber cemented on: there is no drawing. Just start carving! First, do a practice piece to learn the technique of Old World chip carving. Students then choose to carve a beautiful design on small box, a napkin holder, a trivet, a phone or tablet holder, or other project. The prices range from \$12 - \$27, depending of which is chosen. Jan will provide wipe-on poly, a practice board, patterns. Both of her books will be available for purchase – **Blue Ribbon Chip Carving** and **More Blue Ribbon Chip Carving**. Complete instructions and over 100 pages of patterns and pictures are in each. Students will need a good chip carving knife. Jan will have knives to buy, if needed. Also bring a light and magnifying glasses (if necessary). Class fee is \$40.00.

**2. Lee Belanger** will teach a class on carving a one-sided whimsical cottonwood bark house. Tools needed: detail knife, bench knife, micro carving tools, normal carving tools, and power carving equipment. Cost of material: \$15.00 (which includes one piece of cottonwood bark) Intermediate and above skill level. Class size max. 10 Class fee: \$30.00



**3. Dave Kublank** (Grandpa Dave) has taught at Boulder Jct. for several years doing spoons and flat plane carving. This year he will offer a class in Stylistic Carving. This form is carved and sanded to give a smooth finish. It then has a finish put on to bring out the beauty of the wood. It is an enjoyable and satisfying form of carving. The cost of materials will range from \$5 to \$25.



**4. Dan Haack** will teach carving caricatures and wood spirits. You can bring a rough-out of your choice or if you want Dan to provide one, contact him at least 6 weeks before the workshop. Material for the wood spirit will be provided. His email is [danwoodcarver@gmail.com](mailto:danwoodcarver@gmail.com). Phone 715-360-1418. Tools needed: a sharp knife and palm tools. Rough out provided varies between \$20 -\$30. Material for wood spirits \$5 - \$10. Skill level intermediate and above.



**5. Denny Neubauer** We will be making a knife or gouge out of a drill bit or round drill stock. Students will have your choice of handle material, cholla cactus or hard woods. Denny has developed dye sets for a 3, 5 or 7 sweep gouges. He will also cover different methods of sharpening and carving little people out of a 1" square sticks that will be 2-8" long. Class fee \$35 Extra knife blanks \$5



**6. Greg Wirtz** will teach relief carving and will have multiple patterns to choose from. Greg has some new wildlife animal patterns from which to choose. Tools needed: Sharp knife, gouges, especially #3s, #5s, V, and whatever other hand gouges you might have along with your own paint brushes. All else will be provided. All skill levels. Class fee \$25 depending on size and type of wood. Additional fall and Santa patterns for intaglio will be available.



**7. Bob Harris**—The class workshop topic is a Cliff Swallow. This small rounded bird has many special challenges in carving and painting. A blank with instructions will be sent to you prior to class along with a list of other supplies needed. Painting will be done in class. Class size 10-12 and cost is \$25.



**8. Gordy Moscinski** will teach a beginning carving class that will cover basic carving techniques including the safe use of carving tools, sharpening and finishes. There will be a variety of carvings to choose from. Including in the round, chip, and relief. Paints will be available. Class fee \$35 for blanks supplied. Knives will be available for purchase at the workshop.



**9. James Thalacker** will be teaching a 10" Walleye pike with closed gills and mouth for painting in the 2021 class. Students should start planning and making the habitat to mount the fish. The same sharp tools (hand and power) along with pencils, sand paper, wood burner (medium and small scale tips) photos for reference. Some might consider entering the completed work in the World Fish Carving in Peoria 2021. The cost will be \$100 for the class and \$20 for materials which will include: pattern, fish cutout, fins, and glass eyes. Any more questions please feel free to call me at 563-580-5834



**10. Larry Stenzel** will be teaching Wood Burning. The class will be for all skill levels: Basics for newcomers and more advanced techniques for experienced burners. Covered will be safety, composition, shading and textures, coloring, finishing, and displaying your work of art. Wood will be supplied for several projects, as well as all the supplies you will need. He will have many patterns that you can use – or you can bring your own. Tools needed: a variable-temperature wood burner and tips. Class fee: \$40
